

# Nan Clach Extension Limited

Notice is hereby given that Nan Clach Extension Limited, company registration number 12642086, with its registered office at 16 West Borough, Wimborne BH21 1NG, has submitted additional information to the Scottish Ministers in relation to the application for consent under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a wind farm known as Tom na Clach Wind Farm Extension, near Nairn in Highland Council area (Central Grid Reference E287153 N834447). The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be over 50MW, as an Extension to Tom nan Clach Wind Farm, comprising up to 7 turbines with a maximum ground to blade tip height of 149.9 metres. The proposed development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment. An EIA Report has been produced to accompany the application for consent.

The Company has also asked that Scottish Ministers give a direction under section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted.

Nanclach Extension Limited **has now submitted additional information to Scottish Ministers, which includes information relating to** minor changes to the proposed development involving the micrositing of two turbines and related infrastructure, incorporating written text, supporting figures and appendices.

All representations should be received not later than January 31st 2023 although Ministers may consider representations received after this date.

Any subsequent additional information which is submitted by the developer will be subject to further public notice in this manner, and representations to such information will be accepted as per this notice.

As a result of a statutory objection from the relevant planning authority, or where Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, Scottish Ministers can also cause a public inquiry to be held.

Following examination of the environmental information, Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in one of two ways: consent the proposal (with or without conditions attached), or reject the proposal.
